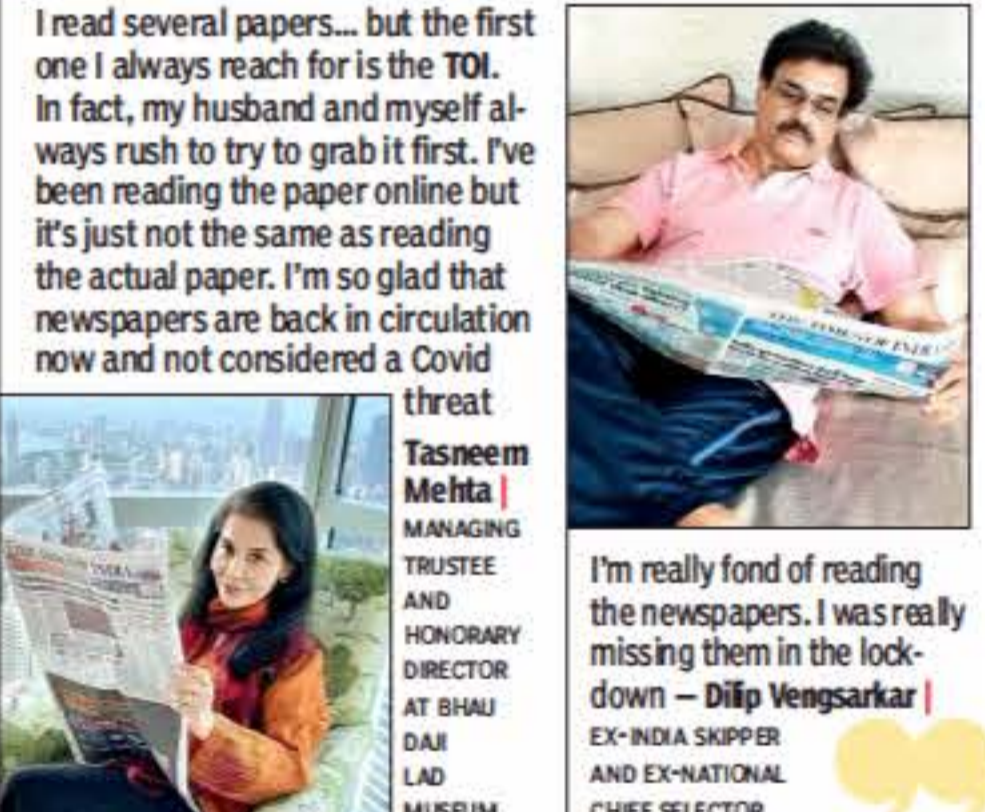
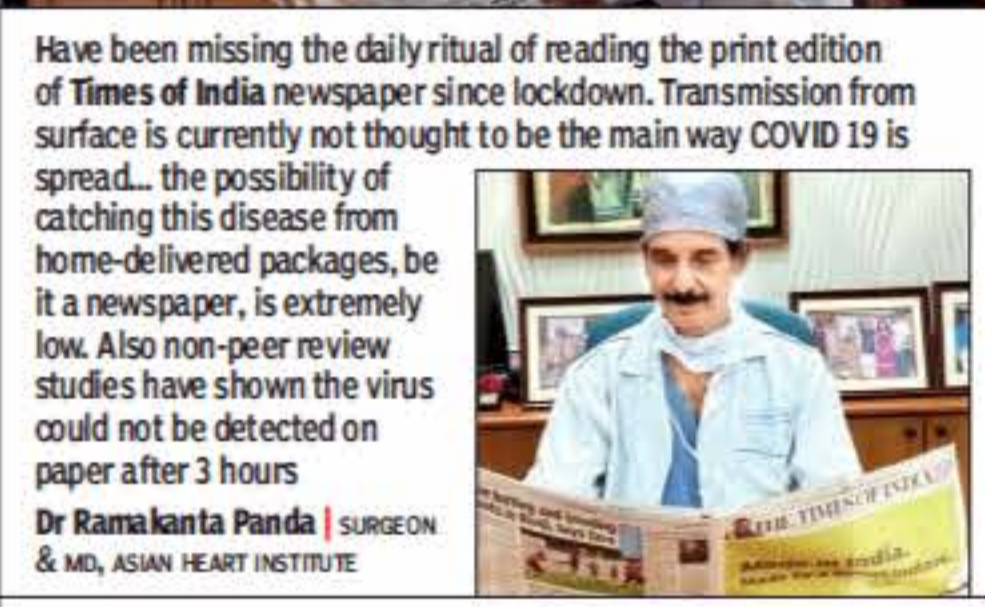

**₹50L to kin of BMC staff who die of Covid**

Mumbai: The BMC on Monday announced that it would grant Rs 50 lakh compensation to the kin of employees who died of Covid. So far, 55 BMC employees died after testing positive for the virus. Compensation will also be granted to the kin of on contractual staff. Last month, it had announced Rs 10 lakh as compensation amount.

A civic official said that the employee should have reported to work 14 days prior to death. "If there is any doubt over the test report of an employee suspected to be a Covid victim, a panel of deans of major BMC hospitals will take a call on compensation," said the official. —Richa Pinto

**Murder victim's body missing from morgue**

Mumbai: In the third such incident, the body of a youth has gone missing from the morgue of Rajawadi Hospital in Ghatkopar.

Deonar resident, Mehraz Shaikh, who was stabbed by a rival on June 3, was admitted to Rajawadi Hospital with serious injuries. "He passed away the same night. Since it was necessary to do a Covid test before post-mortem, his body was kept in the hospital morgue," said former BJP MP Kirit Somaiya.

Somaiya said his Covid test report returned positive on Sunday. When the Deonar police went to collect Shaikh's body to hand it over for post-mortem, they found it was missing. "It's ridiculous that bodies are going missing from government-run hospital morgues. It is a failure of the system as this is the third such incident," said Somaiya.

Speaking to TOI, dean of Rajawadi Hospital, Dr Vidya Thakur said, "It is too early to say 'missing' as the body may have been misplaced. Our team is looking for the body and we will get it soon."

Last week, the family of 41-year-old real estate agent, Rakesh Verma, filed a complaint against the civic body, police and staffers of a Jogeshwari hospital for cremating him without informing them.

**Week-long gas leak at Mahul: Resident to HC**

Mumbai: There was a week-long gas leak at Mahul and BMC took note of it on social media, a resident has told Bombay high court. Narayan Mahulkar (60) filed an affidavit supporting a PIL that opposed BMC's shifting of suspected Covid-19 patients to Mahul for quarantine, as it is highly polluted.

The PIL was filed by Sharda Tevar, mother of an undertrial at Arthur Road jail, and NGO Ghar Bachao Ghar Banao Andolan. BMC wants to use three buildings with 550 tenements at Eversmile Complex and eight buildings with 750 tenements at Ampapada SRA.

The PIL will be heard by HC on Tuesday. —TW

**Mosques set rules for community namaz**

Mumbai: Community namaz in the aftermath of coronavirus will be a changed affair once public prayers resume at city mosques. As places of worship opened in Delhi Monday, mosques in this city also issued a common set of guidelines to be followed.

Muslims are instructed to perform the 'wuzoo' (mandatory ablution before namaz) at home rather than use the common facility in the masjid. Also, they must offer only the five mandatory prayers in mosque. Other voluntary prayers must be held at home.

"Wearing masks will be compulsory. We are urging children under 10 and elders over 65 to pray at home and not visit the masjid. Also those who have an ailment or fever must avoid coming to the masjid," said Maulana Akram Ishati of Four Banglows Qabranast Masjid.

Maulana Burhanuddin Qasmi of Markazul Maarif, Jogeshwari, said, "Social distance should be maintained while praying, and worshippers are urged to bring their own prayer mats. They must desist from using common mats, rosary beads, caps and copies of the Holy Quran kept in mosques. Shoes must be kept separately, not bunched atop each other. If required, two sessions of Friday namaz will be held."

Since the lockdown, mosques have been closed for the public. —Bella Jaisinghani

**Sealed bldgs up by 1,000 in a fortnight**

Mumbai: On a day offices opened with restricted staffing, heralding an attempt to return to normalcy, it emerged that over 50,000 Mumbai-kars have now tested positive for Covid-19, and 4,071 buildings in the city are either entirely sealed or have floors or parts of floors sealed. As for containment zones, their number now stand at 775. In comparison, as of May 27, the number of sealed buildings (including partly sealed structures) in Mumbai stood at 3,097 while containment zones numbered 696.

The maximum number of buildings currently under some extent of sealing are in the R-Central ward, 345; the ward comprises the Borivli, Gorai and Magathane belt. Next in line are P-South (Goregaon and Aarey Colony), which has 270 such buildings, and K-West (Andheri-W, Vile Parle-W, Juhu), which has 269.

In all, 6,924 buildings in Mumbai have come under some extent of sealing since the Covid-19 outbreak started in the city. Of this number, the sealing of close to 3,000 buildings now stand lifted.

Officials have said that the sealing of floors instead of an entire complex when it comes to large housing societies has proved to be a positive decision since it does not inconvenience many others who have had no contact with a particular wing or floor where a person tested positive for Covid-19.

"In May, the protocol in Mumbai for the sealing of buildings where Covid-19 cases are found was revised. According to the same, if there is a positive case in a society or building, the entire building need not be sealed. Instead, only that floor needs to be sealed as decided by civic officials, depending on the situation. Also, once the affected residents of a building complete their 14-day quarantine period, and if no new positive cases are found there, the building is unsealed," said an official.

Differences have been observed in the way sealing is treated by societies. Congress corporator from F-North ward, Ravi Raja, said that private housing societies especially take the sealing of floors very seriously. "Rules are immediately laid down within private complexes. But in case of smaller standalone buildings, it is found that sealing is not taken very seriously. It is essential that people quarantine themselves, especially when they live on the same floor as a patient," he said.

BJP corporator from R-Central ward, Vidhyarthi Singh, "The BMC comes and places a board that the building or the floor has been sealed as a Covid-19 patient has been traced. But after that, there is no supervision or checking. Also, people are not taking the crisis seriously. With the markets now opening, I am seeing people in Borivli move around, maintaining zero social distancing."

**90 cricketers of local clubs donate blood**

Mumbai: As blood banks in the city dry up, over 90 cricketers who play for various local clubs in the city donated blood at a drive organised by JJ Hospital, Byculla. The donors included current Mumbai senior team players Vinayak Bhoir and Royston Dias. It was in association with Vishnu Vaman Thakur Charitable Trust, Viva College and MCA-affiliated Sainath Sports Club and Our's Cricket Club, in Virar. Also, Kshitij Thakur, MIA of BVAdonated blood.

Ajinkya Naik said, "These cricketers have set an example for the state and country to come forward and serve the nation." —Gaurav Gupta

**Colaba's ward leads with 75% discharge rate**

Mumbai: The high-profile A ward, which comprises Colaba, Cuffe Parade, Fort and Churchgate, has registered a 75% rate of discharge of Covid-19 patients, the highest among the city's 24 administrative wards. In comparison, the average discharge rate for coronavirus patients in the city is 43%.

A ward also has the lowest number of active cases, 297. Its cumulative was 1,170 cases as of Sunday. The ward has housing societies where senior bureaucrats live and also has residences of ministers. The Covid-19 case doubling rate for the ward is 31 days, as compared to the city average of 23.

Ward officials said they housed high-risk contacts and those with mild symptoms in 350 rooms in different hotels, hired for the purpose. But a local BJP corporator alleged that the BMC is not conducting regular fever clinics in A ward's slum pockets and testing few people, to show such "impressive" results.

"The ward is not testing enough, which is why we staged a protest at the BMC headquarters recently. We have big slum pockets like Ganesh Murti Nagar and Ambedkar Nagar. The BMC has not conducted a fever clinic in those areas in the last 15 days, although the areas had reported several positive cases. The BMC is adopting such tactics to show an improvement, although the situation on the ground is disastrous," said BJP corporator from Colaba Makarand Narwekar.

BMC officials denied the allegation, saying that the ward's residents are affluent and have a good understanding of personal hygiene, which is helping the civic body to control viral spread.

Officials said they have managed to bring down the mortality rate in the ward after deciding to shift senior citizens suffering from Covid-19 and who have comorbidities to hospitals instead of Covid Care Centres for emergency attention. The ward had recorded 21 Covid-19 deaths till Sunday.
